Sport stacking participants "up-stack and down-stack" specially designed plastic cups in predetermined sequences with lightning quickness and skill that requires extraordinary hand-eye coordination and concentration. Information

Mrs. White informed the Board that the state mileage reimbursement rate was being increased a penny, from \$.55.5 to \$.56.5, and, in accordance with Administrative Rule C-18, the district's reimbursement rate will be consistent with the state's.

Mrs. White informed the Board that the FY 2015 Capital Plan was in their folder to review and submit questions. The Planning and Construction Department will be back to the Board at the May 21 meeting to address those questions. The Board will vote on the issue after all questions are addressed.

Board Business Action

The Board unanimously approved a request by the School Improvement Council and Administration of Robert Smalls Middle School to name the school's athletics complex after Rocco Cavalluzzi. Mr. Cavalluzzi was a veteran, highly regarded teacher who passed away in February. A dedication of the facility will be held on May 23 at 5:30 PM at the school.

Dr. Rosswurm presented the recent results of the lottery at Riverview Charter School. She commented that the process was much improved this year. The results fell within the guidelines of the Office of Civil Rights and were unanimously approved by the Board.

The Board approved a donation from United States Marine Corps in the amount of \$3,500 designated for the wrestling program at Hilton Head Island High School.

The Board approved a request for fundraising by the Coosa Elementary PTO to construct an outdoor pavilion. The shade structure pavilion will be used for classroom and outdoor meeting space.

In accordance with state provisos 1.38, 1.43, and 1A.21, the Board approved a motion to allow the District administration to transfer limited special revenue funds from one category to another. The transferred funds will be used on classroom instruction.

The Board passed a motion to approve and certify to the Beaufort County Council a Fiscal Year 2013-2014 General Fund Budget in the amount of \$182,906,012. The anticipated revenue in the amount of \$183,234,997 would be derived from the following sources:

\$114,868,815 property tax collection

\$61,645,428 state revenues

\$900,000 federal sources

\$1,463,500 other local sources

\$4,357,254 inter-fund transfers

The Board approved a proposal for Board Committee Structures in accordance with BCR 9. The Board also discussed committee memberships for upcoming strategic planning committees.

The consent agenda was approved.
