Superintendent's Board of Education meeting summary: December 9, 2014

Chairman Bill Evans called the meeting to order at 4 p.m., and the Board went into executive session. The Board reconvened at 5 p.m. with no action reported out of the executive session.

Motion to approve the meeting agenda as presented. Approved.

Pledge of Allegiance and invocation.

The Beaufort Middle School Lady Gryphon Singers, led by June Kirkland, performed "Night of Silence" in honor of the upcoming holidays. Then members of the BLMS seventh-grade symphonic band, led by Zachary Dobbs, provided some samples from their Winter Concert.

Points of Celebration (presented by Dr. Moss)

A group of Bluffton High students just returned from a trip to our state capital. Under the guidance of teacher Erin Reichert, the Youth in Government students competed in the State Conference at the Statehouse and returned with several awards, including the "Premier Delegation" designation for the eighth consecutive year.

Bluffton High's top student team this year was edged out for the top spot by the Governor's School for Science and Mathematics, an academic magnet school that draws students from the entire state. Coordinating Bluffton High's teams was Business Education Teacher Brett Wolfe, and the students on the second-place team were ShanaKay Ellington, G Ashley McCord, Denny Villatoro, and Deanna Nowakowski.

The Kiwanis Club of Hilton Head Island has donated more than \$1,000 in supplies to the Navy Junior ROTC program at Hilton Head Island High. This includes air rifle team equipment. Mr. Jerry Glass, President of the Kiwanis, is present to accept a certificate of our appreciation.

Chairman's Report

Chairman Evans reported on the SCSBA meeting, which focused on school finance issues and included an address from State Superintendent-elect Molly Spearman. Mr. Evans also recognized Jim Beckert for his service on the Board of Education.

The committee also discussed the expansion of facilities and capacities at Hilton Head Island Early Childhood Center for fall 2016 and the expansion of the federal E-Rate program through 2015.

Student Services: Ms. Anderson said the committee will meet December 15 at 4:30 p.m. at Okatie Elementary to discuss transportation and lottery issues.

Website and Communications: No report.

Chairman Evans asked Mr. Campbell to give an update on the Town Hall meeting at Whale Branch Early College High School. Mr. Campbell stated that there was good participation in the Town Hall meeting and healthy discussions about adequate teacher staffing and quality instruction.

Superintendent's Report

Dr. Moss announced personnel changes, including the appointment of Chad Cox as principal of WBMS, Neodria Brown as principal of HHIMS and Reginald Deas as Director of Personnel.

Dr. Moss introduced Dr. Rhoads, who asked CATE Director Karen Gilbert to present CATE program updates. Her presentation covered an expansion of a variety of CATE courses, as well as the recent CATE Expo that allowed students to meet with representatives from multiple area companies, which drew more than 200 students and 20 companies.

Dr. Moss introduced Phyllis White to report on the external financial audit recently completed by Elliott Davis. The report included financial statements and management analysis. Elliott Davis gave the highest level of approval for the district's finances and internal controls.

Motion to accept all contract amendments within the extension of the superintendent's contract. Approved.

Motion to approve the topic of "employee dismissal act" on the 2015 Legislative Agenda. Tabled for further discussion.

Chairman Evans asked for an update on the Connect2Learn rollout.

Ms. Bush asked for a list of all Winter/Holiday performances, which has been posted on the district website.

Consent Agenda

Motion to approve the consent agenda. Approved.

Joint Meeting with School Improvement Council Members

Board members held roundtable discussions with School Improvement Council members from across the school district. After the discussions ended, Chairman Evans provided a summary of key topics: school choice, transportation and transfers, K-8 schools, new school curricula, broadband capacity, bus overcrowding, 4x4 scheduling, school calendars, Act 388 and staffing.

Ms. Bush asked for statistics related to the pilot late start initiative at HHIHS.
