• Superintendent's Recommendation – Motion to hold an April 21 county-wide bond referendum for general obligation bonds not to exceed \$76 million for additional classrooms at River Ridge Academy and May River High School, a new school in Bluffton and new Career and Technical Education buildings at Beaufort, Bluffton and Hilton Head Island high schools similar to current facilities at Battery Creek and May River high schools. Motion to amend the motion to reschedule the referendum for the November general election ballot. Board discussion. Amended motion failed. Original motion approved. Separate motion to approve funds not to exceed \$1.2 million to purchase and install mobile classrooms at Pritchardville Elementary and River Ridge Academy. Board discussion. Motion approved.
