- **I. Purpose.** To establish the basic structure for <u>BCSD</u> alternative programs, schools, and education.
- II. <u>Alternative Education Purposes.</u> Alternative learning programs and schools are provided as an option for those instances in which a student's behavior management or academic performance needs cannot be met in a regular educational setting. The purpose of the <u>BCSD alternative programs and school aretherefore is</u> to:
 - A. Intervene and address problems that preventing a student from achieving success in the regular educational setting;
 - B. Reduce the risk that a student will drop out of school by providing resources to help the resolve issues affecting his or her performance at school;
 - C. Return a student, if and when it is practicable, to the regular educational setting with the skills necessary to succeed in that environment; and
 - D. Maintain a safe and orderly learning environment in the regular educational setting.
- III. Alternative Education Focus. The alternative school or program will focus resources to assist the students to resolve issues that are affecting performance at the home school, maintain opportunities for students to stay on track academically toward graduation; in a highly structure environment, and to-maintain and offer courses that are comparable to those the students are is enrolled in prior to entering the alterative setting. -Additionally, the BCSD alternative school may emphasize behavioral and social skills development, interventions and enrichment, job training and employment skills.
- **IV.** Assignment to Alternative School/Program. The alternative school or program will identify and follow procedures for voluntary or involuntary assignment and transfer to and from the home school. Additionally, prior to transfer to the alternative setting. The homeschool will document the procedures for: investigating misconduct incidences or academic failures, conducting hearings, reporting, making recommendations for suspension, probation, expulsion, and/or voluntary or involuntary assignment to an alternative program or school.
