Superintendent's Board Meeting Summary: September 1, 2015

Chairman Bill Evans called the meeting to order at 6:05 p.m.

There was no action coming out of the executive session.

Motion to approve the agenda. Approved.

Pledge of Allegiance, invocation by Rev. Rivers.

Points of Celebration (as delivered by Superintendent Moss)

BHS ENGINEERING TEAM

We mentioned this achievement at a Board meeting several months ago, but because the students were not able to attend, we postponed delayed their recognitions until tonight.

Two teams of Beaufort High students won a pair of prestigious honors in the 2015 Project Lead the Way State Engineering Championship held at the University of South Carolina's Engineering Center.

The Introduction to Engineering Design Team took home the 2015 championship trophy, narrowly beating out Columbia's Dutch Fork High. The team of Anna Kate D'Angelo, Jackie Kim and Lucas Cato reverse-engineered a series of toys for a hypothetical company whose engineering records had been destroyed by fire.

The Principles of Engineering team won Best Presentation. Working in a timed competition, that team — Chris Richardson, Deven Singleton and Casey Allen — designed, built and tested a device to contain a product load released with a remote dump feature on the end of a support arm, all cantilevered off the edge of a table top.

Beaufort High has participated in the state competition the last five years, winning two state championships and one state runner-up title.

<u>Bre-Anna Heyward – BHS National Guard Honor</u>

At just 17 years of age, Bre-Anna Heyward-White has made National Guard history. About three weeks ago, Bre-Anna attended National Guard training for the first time. As a state champion track and field athlete and a member of Beaufort High's JROTC program, she was prepared for the challenge of the two-mile run. But she was still surprised when she was the top female finisher in her squadron. Bre-Anna then made the choice of specializing in Combat Engineering — a choice that ultimately made history when she became the first African-American female in National Guard history to be accepted for combat engineer training. Bre-Anna, if you would please come forward.

BMS eCybermission

eCybermission is a U.S. Army educational outreach program based on competitions designed to engage students interested in STEM education. The competitions are web-based, with students solving real-life problems in their communities.

First place in South Carolina's statewide competition went to a team from Beaufort Middle School that created a recycling awareness campaign. As a result of that campaign, the amount of recycled items at Beaufort Middle more than doubled.

First-place team members are Christy Stowe, Hope Locke and Ky McLemore. They each received a \$1,000 savings bond from eCybermission. Their team advisor was Chandra Payne, and they were assisted by Beaufort County Recycling Coordinator Kathryn Madden.

Legislative and Outreach Committee: At the last meeting, the committee reviewed the legislative agenda and legislation pertaining to the ACE transition team. At the next meeting, there will be an update on the SCSBA law conference that took place last week.

Student Services: The committee met on August 25 and discussed assistance for state competition winners, Board policy pertaining to diversity guidelines and the calendar for remainder of the year. The committee's next meeting will be Sept. 22.

Motion to approve resolutions celebrating the National Arts in Education, National Hispanic Heritage Month, and Constitution Week as recommended by the Student Services Committee. Approved.

The Board discussed proposed revisions to BCR 13: Cost of Board Governance. Motion to approve the revisions. Mr. Roth expressed concerns, and Board members engaged in an extended discussion. Mr. Rivers moved to table the issue but withdrew the motion. Original motion to approve the revisions was approved.
