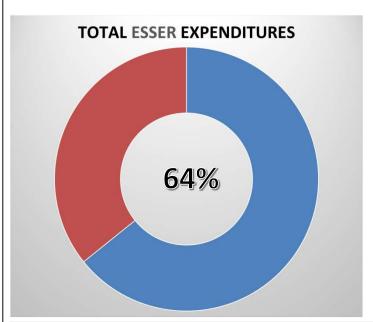

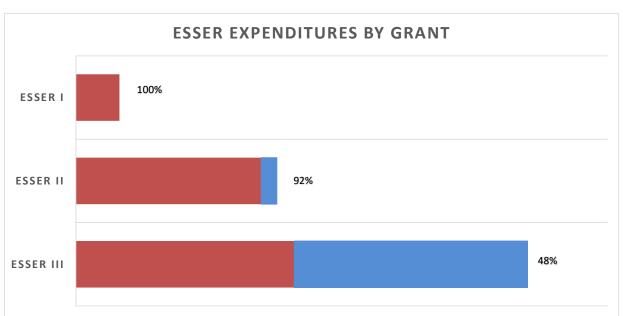

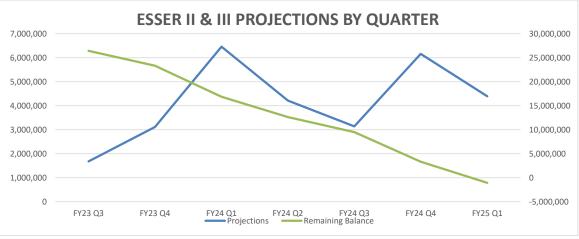
Total Expenditures for December 2022 and January 2023 \$ 11,219,254
