- GRADUATIONS
  - Proud students and their parents attended graduation ceremonies for Beaufort County high school seniors who completed their diploma requirements over the summer. Fifty-one "recovery graduates" received their diplomas during August 17 ceremonies at Battery Creek High School, and that's a big increase from the 21 students who received diplomas in last year's summer ceremonies. A job well done, not only by the determined students and their parents, but also by the staff at our high schools who stuck with these 51 students during the summer and made certain that they completed their diploma requirements successfully. In addition to the district students who graduated on August 17, 56 adult education students also received their diplomas.
- We are part of Grad Nation and ON-TIME GRADUATION is our focus! To kick-off this most important initiative is the September 7<sup>th</sup> State of the Schools Breakfast co-hosted by the Beaufort and Jasper County Boards of Education. ## Showcase – Starbase

Mr. Robert Semmler, Director of STARBASE MCAS Beaufort

Mr. Semmler presented an update on the STARBASE Program at MCAS. This year's program will begin September 10<sup>th</sup> and go through May. Approximately 1000 students are scheduled to go to the STARBASE Program this year. Future plans include a STARBASE 2 Program for Middle School students. STARBASE emphasizes math, science, and engineering.

## Superintendent's Report

Update on Student Achievement and Targeted Schools

- Percent of student on or above grade level for both READING and MATH has increased in all grades (k-8) since 2009.
- Percent of students passing End of Course exams in Algebra1, English, and U.S. History has increased since 2009. The percent of students passing Biology has increased since 2011, the first year the assessment was administered.
- The percent of students failing to meet standard on PASS has decreased in all grades (3-8) in Math, and grades 3,4,7,8 in ELA. Only grades 5 & 6 have increased since 2009.

• The per cent of students passing ELA and Math on the first attempt of High School Exit Exam (HSAP) has increased since 2009.

Targeted Schools with higher achievement gaps in reading and math from state levels: St. Helena, Broad River, Shanklin, Whale Branch Elementary, Whale Branch Middle. Recommendation to the Board to support the concept of targeting resources as listed below. There is no need to amend the budget, only to concur that there is a shift in resources to support the five schools more intensely.

Proposed Change to IS-43 Grading/Assessment Systems Administrative rule was presented to the Board for review. To be discussed at the next meeting.

Mrs. White presented a change to the Mileage Rate to be consistent with the standard mileage rate established by the State of South Carolina. The old rate was 44.5 cents and the new rate would be 55.5 cents. The Board approved the increase on a 9-1 vote.

Dr. Truesdale presented to the board as information enrollment comparisons 2010-2012. Nine schools have lost student while the remaining have gained. First day enrollment was 19,671 county-wide.

# **Board Business**

Riverview Annual Report – tabled to next meeting.

The board approved a resolution authorizing the issuance and sale of not exceeding \$10,000,000 general obligation bonds.

The board approved a second resolution authorizing the issuance and sale of not exceeding \$3,160,000 general obligation bonds.

The board approved a donation of \$1,000 from the Sea Island Rotary Club for school uniforms at Beaufort Middle School.
