TOPIC:

Equity in School Lunch Pricing - Section 205 of the Healthy, Hunger Free

Kids Act of 2010

Background

Effective July 1, 2011, section 205 of the Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010 requires school food authorities (SFAs) participating in the National School Lunch Program to provide the same level of support for lunches served to students who are not eligible for free or reduced price lunches (i.e. paid lunches) as they are for lunches served to students eligible for free lunches.

School districts that have programs that charge less than the USDA reimbursement amount of \$3.15 are required to gradually increase their prices over time until they meet the requirement. The attached worksheet demonstrates the calculation.

The last time BCSD was required to increase meal prices was in FY 2014 bringing the meal prices to the following levels:

Elementary - \$1.55 Secondary - \$2.05

According to the attached worksheet, we should raise each of the levels by \$.18, however, there is a \$.10 maximum cap. Therefore, for FY 216-2017 the following lunch prices must be put in place:

Elementary - \$1.65 Secondary - \$2.15
