Lyn: The \$7.7 million is the projected shortfall in collections for the current FY. It's on page 5 of the attachment. It's the projected result of current year budgeted spending vs. projected revenue. It hits the fund balance harder than anticipated. Keep in mind that no significant revenues will flow in until November, and most of them hit at the end of December when the mortgage companies/banks pay them from borrower escrow accounts. Hurricane season is well under way by then. If it sounds risky, it is. You wouldn't run your household this way.

It's largely a result of failed reassessment year millage rate roll down calculation required by state law. Nobody has taken "credit" for that failure yet. County Council is the only authority that can create a millage tax ordinance. That happens after the BOE certifies its' budget. To the credit of the Board, they passed a motion brought by John and JoAnn to get to the bottom of this and seek compensation if warranted. None of this means much to taxpayers who will pick up the tab either way. Or to Bond Rating agencies who know risk when they see it.

All the BOE does is create differentiation on what is good and bad spending. That's the focus and the time to do that for the next FY year is dwindling. They really didn't need the CFO to drop this on them unexpectedly. The current state doesn't deserve applause for the BOE or County CFO's. Meanwhile, the heat is on! Stay tuned! - Mike
