- I. Purpose. To establish the <u>S</u>superintendent's expectations for publication of student honor rolls in the <u>BCSD</u>.
- II. The administration encourages and fosters the development of intellectual student ability, desirable traits of character and qualities of leadership. The administration will support programs which recognizinge outstanding student achievement far in excess of minimum requirements in these areas. These programs may include honor rolls, honor societies, special awards or special recognition at honors programs and/or commencement exercises.
- III. The <u>S</u>superintendent directs the certified staff to develop procedures for these recognition programs <u>towhich will</u> focus on <u>the</u> core academic areas and honor scholarship and/or distinguished service by students in any school activity. The criteria and procedures will make clear the relationship between the honor and the relevant goal or goals of the schools.
- IV. Criteria for Hhonor Rrolls are as follows:
 - A. High Sschools.
 - 1. "School's Mascot" Honor Roll = 3.00 or higher with no grade below a "C" and no more than one "C"
 - 2.1. A student will be named to the "School's Mascot" Distinguished Honor Roll if he/she has no letter grade below a B for that grading period. All "A's" and "B's
 - 3.2. A student will be named to the *Principal's Honor Roll if he/she has no grade less than an A for that grading period. All "A's
 - B. Middle Sschools.
 - 1. A student will be named to the Principal's Hhonor rRoll if he/she attains a grade of equals-93 or and above in all subjects/classes for that grading period.
 - 2. A student will be named to the Honor Refoll if he/she attains a grade of equals 85 or and above in all subjects/classes for that grading period.
 - C. Elementary Sschools. that provide numeric grades
 - 1. Elementary Schools Providing Numeric Grades.
 - a. A student will be named to the Principal's Hhonor Rroll if she attains a grade of equals 93 or and above in all subjects/classes for that grading period.

a.b. A student will be named to the Honor Roll if she attains a grade of 85 or above in all subjects/classes for that grading period

- 1.2. Honor roll equals 85 and above in all subjects/classes.
- 2.3. Elementary schools that do not provide numeric grades will develop criteria tothat honor students for academic excellence.
- 3.4. All elementary schools will recognize scholarship independently of citizenship as part of the honor roll process.
