price for their cruise. The truth is, the best time to book can vary depending on your destination, the number of people in your party and a few other factors.

Generally, though, I recommend waiting until about 60 to 90 days before departure to book. Most ships will be marked down around this time, and these prices usually prove to be the lowest ever offered for that departure — lower than early bird discounts, and lower than prices available within the last couple of weeks.

Most cruises departing between now and the end of March have been marked down to the lowest rate that will be available, so if you are planning to cruise during this period, it's time to shop and give us a call. For a list of the very best deals still available during this time frame, click here.

If you're planning to cruise after the first quarter of the year, you may want to wait to see if deeper discounts develop before booking. There are, of course, a few notable exceptions. Here they are:







I receive several hundred cruise-related questions every week from my readers, so today I'd like to share a few inquiries and answers.

Q: I see a number of repositioning cruises on your 90-Day Ticker. What are repositioning cruises?

A: These unique itineraries are offered when cruise lines reposition their ships between seasonal

destinations. Some of the most popular repositionings are trans-Atlantic voyages from the Caribbean to the Mediterranean in the spring -- you'll see a few examples of this on our <u>90-Day Ticker</u> now -- or the reverse in the fall. You can find a selection of repositionings throughout the year, though, as ships move from region to region around the globe. For example, a ship that has finished up a summer of cruising in Alaska might relocate in the fall, via the Panama Canal, to a Florida port for a winter of Caribbean sailing.

It's a win-win for cruise lines that would rather operate a ship with passengers on board, and for travelers who enjoy laid-back sea voyages. Best of all, repositioning cruises often boast lower than average perdiem prices. Here are a few examples departing this spring.

A 13-night cruise from Miami to London departing April 21, **starting from \$38** per person, per night (<u>FastDeal #14147</u>).

A 14-night cruise from Barbados to Lisbon departing March 24, **starting from \$49** per person, per night (<u>FastDeal #26681</u>).

Usually, port calls along the way are sparse; most repositioning itineraries are filled with days at sea as your ship crosses the ocean. Q: If I book my cruise now and the price goes down later, will I be able to get the lower rate?

A: Cruise prices fluctuate up and down all the time at the cruise lines' discretion, depending on how well a cruise is selling and the number of days remaining until departure. Unfortunately, the decision of whether to allow a customer to re-ticket at a lower rate is never made by Vacations To Go. Every cruise line has a specific policy that it does not deviate from, and we must abide by that policy.

Some lines will adjust the price for your cruise if a lower rate becomes available for the category you've reserved, as long as you have not yet made final payment and still are outside the penalty period, which typically begins 75 to 90 days in advance of departure. Most cruise lines, however, do not adjust the price. Your Vacations To Go cruise counselor will be able to advise you on each cruise line's policy.

Q: Can I book the airfare for my cruise with you, and a hotel stay in the departure port city before the cruise?

A: Yes, your Vacations To Go travel counselor will be happy to price and book airfare to and from your cruise's embarkation and disembarkation city or cities, as well as pre- and post-cruise hotel stays. We do recommend that our customers who have a long-haul flight to their embarkation port (for example, from the U.S. to Europe) arrive one or two days early. This will ensure that you don't miss your ship departure due to airline delays, and it will afford you time to get over jet lag and do some sightseeing before boarding the ship.

Q: Are cruises all-inclusive? What can I expect to pay extra for on board?

A: The upfront rate of your cruise includes your cabin, meals and snacks, entertainment, children's programs, a diverse array of activities day and night and, of course, all transportation between the ports on your itinerary -- making it the best vacation value there is.

On most ships, alcoholic beverages and soft drinks, spa treatments, optional shore excursions, gratuities and meals in specialty restaurants will incur an additional cost. There are a handful of six-star lines that include all beverages (including alcoholic and nonalcoholic drinks, sodas, bottled water and specialty coffees) and gratuities in the upfront rate, and while these sailings are never inexpensive, they do provide an outstanding value in luxury travel.

Q: We are planning an extended family cruise for this summer. Two in our group follow a gluten-free diet, and another is a vegetarian. As for me, I need to watch my sodium. Will a cruise ship be able to meet our needs?

A: Most cruise lines are equipped to accommodate special dining needs -- including food allergies and gluten-free, low-fat, low-sodium, low-sugar, vegetarian and kosher needs -- as long as they receive advance notice. Please inform your Vacations To Go travel counselor of any dietary requirements as soon as possible. They can contact the cruise line's special needs department and communicate all necessary arrangements for your diet on board.

Superintendent's Board of Education meeting summary two-day work session

Superintendent's Board of Education meeting summary Two-day work session, February 2-3, 2018

Day 1 – February 2, 2018

Chair Earl Campbell convened the first day of the Board's two-day work session at 8:39 a.m.

Motion to remove the legislative plan from Saturday's agenda. The agenda was approved as amended.

Pledge of allegiance and invocation. A moment of silence for a former principal of St. Helena Elementary, Mildred Wilson.

Public Comment: A community member spoke about recent news media reports on the school district and the roof at Hilton Head Island High School, which was recently inspected by the South Carolina Department of Education and found to be structurally sound.

General Counsel Drew Davis presented on the state Freedom of Information Act and how that law specifies what constitutes a Board meeting. Mr. Davis addressed the Board's questions.

Mr. Campbell made a statement regarding the professionalism of district staff. He also made a statement regarding Board members' communications, and there was a brief discussion.

The Board discussed the Committee of the Whole format and suggested different options for the meeting. Board members discussed a Beaufort County Channel proposal to provide video services at Board meetings.

Chief Finance and Operations Officer Tonya Crosby presented on the district's procurement processes and requirements, and she and Director of Internal Controls Reggie Murphy addressed Board members' questions.

The Board discussed work performed by outside contractors. Mr. Campbell said that when outside contractors are employed by the Board, the scope of their work should be specifically defined.

Chief Administrative and Human Resources Officer Alice Walton and Coordinator of Protective Services David Grissom discussed a recent incident report filed by law enforcement responding to a situation at Battery Creek High School. Ms. Walton, Mr. Grissom, Mr. Davis, and Dr. Moss addressed the Board's questions.

The Board discussed a request from the Teacher Forum to have a regular spot on Board meeting agendas. The Board requested more information from the Teacher Forum before a decision.

Dr. Moss presented Battery Creek High Principal Chad Cox's request to hold the school's 2018 graduation ceremony at 2 p.m. on a Saturday rather than at 7 p.m. on a weekday, and he addressed the Board's questions. The Board will vote on the request at its next Board meeting.

McNair Law Firm Attorney Ms. Frannie Heizer presented on state laws regulating what Board members and school district employees are allowed to do – and what they are not allowed to do – in advance of school bond referendum votes.

Ms. Crosby presented on the preliminary 2018-19 budget, including a budget overview and schedule. She addressed the Board's questions. Facilities, Planning, and Construction Coordinator Robert Oetting presented on the district's five-year Capital Improvement Plan, asked Board members to identify priorities, and addressed the Board's questions.

Dr. Moss provided an estimated cost for a study on impact fees, and he addressed the Board's questions.

Day 1 of the two-day work session was recessed at 4:34 p.m.

Day 2 - February 3, 2018

Chair Campbell reconvened the work session at 8:50 a.m.

Coming out of executive session, Mr. Dowling moved that the Board of Education issue a press release stating that subpoenas have been received from the Office of the U.S. Attorney in conjunction with an investigation by the federal government and that the district will be cooperating fully with the investigation (approved).

Chief Instructional Services Officer Dereck Rhoads briefed the board on a draft calendar for the 2018-19 school year. After a discussion by Board members, motion to approve the draft calendar (approved).

Chief Instructional Services Officer Gregory McCord presented a report on in-school and out-of-school suspensions, noting that the number of fall 2017 incidents resulting in suspensions was lower than in fall 2016.

Dr. McCord also reported on the success of middle and high school athletes in meeting the school district's 2.0 minimum GPA requirement during fall semester 2017-18. Ninety-seven percent of Beaufort County's high school student athletes and 95 percent of middle school student athletes maintained their academic eligibility. Beaufort County is one of only two South Carolina districts that require a 2.0 minimum to participate on athletics teams.

Mr. Davis briefed Board members on how the district handles subpoenas received by the school district.

Board members made comments reviewing the two-day work session.

Motion to adjourn the work session was approved, and the work session was adjourned at 12:35 pm.
