The team competed in four areas (Robot design, Robot Performance, Research Project, and Teamwork) against 79 schools from across SC. WBMS placed 2nd in Teamwork and had an overall ranking of 18 out of 79. Hats off to the following student who showed gracious professionalism in competition (List on screen). The team would like to thank Mrs. Salters and Mrs. Saunders for volunteering their service throughout the Robotics season and all parents who joined us for the trip to Clemson. Three Hilton Head Island High School teachers have been chosen by the International Baccalaureate Organization to serve as examiners. Dora Fletcher, Chris Gray, and Duncan Aspinwall-Winter will grade papers by students from around the world. It is a very high honor to be chosen as an examiner by IBO and we congratulate these teachers on this accomplishment.

The Virtual Enterprise class at Hilton Head Island High School is hosting their "Grand Opening" of the SWAG Surf Shop on Thursday morning with a Ribbon Cutting by Mrs. O'Nan. Their website is up and running and they are ready to sell – virtually that is. Virtual Enterprise students learn how to create, implement and run a business. The students are planning to attend the South Carolina Virtual Enterprise Trade Fair in Columbia, SC on April 12-13 where they will compete in the booth competition and newsletter competition.

One hundred eighty-six students from across the district participated in DaVinci Days last week for the artistically gifted and talented. The students spent 4 hours delving deeper in their arts area – strings, theater, chorus, dance, and visual art. There was no cost for students, for expenses were covered by SC Dept of Education Gifted & Talented funds.

Workshops were held from 9-1 on two school campuses, H E McCracken Middle and Robert Smalls Middle. Quite a few attended courses that most appealed to them rather than limiting their selection to those closest to where they live or attend school. This enabled students to meet and work alongside others across the county who share the same arts interests.

Hilton Head Island High School's Robotics Team recently participated in the Florida Regional Robotics Competition. According to John Quindlen, Robotics Advisor, it was an interesting meet. The robot performed well and was noticed by other teams. This was obvious because for the first time other teams actually had specific strategies in place to try and neutralize the robot's capabilities. Westminster Academy from Fort Lauderdale, FL, chose Hilton Head as a finals alliance partner along with Quincy Public Schools from Quincy, MA. This is the first time Hilton Head made finals as a separate team. Hilton Head's robot was one of only 5 robots that was able to accomplish five of the six tasks in the challenge. No robot accomplished all six of the tasks. Congratulations to the Hilton Head teamand the robot!!

Superintendent's Report

Dr. Jackie Rosswurm, Chief Administrative and Human Resource Officer, gave a report on the student assignment of the Island West Community from Oaktie Elementary to Pritchardville Elementary. The school board discussed the issue and expressed concerns regarding the request from the Office of Civil Rights (OCR). A motion was put on the table to go back and ask OCR to reconsider the request and let the Island West Community remain at Oaktie Elementary because it is only a two-percent difference.

Phyllis White, Chief Operational Services Officer, made a request to the board to consider allowing Port Royal Elementary to establish and afterschool care for students in partnership with the YMCA. A motion was made to have the administration enter into a an agreement with the YMCA for an afterschool program at Port Royal Elementary contingent upon the contract adhering to district guidelines and policies.

Chris Poe, Director of School Facilities, presented a status report of renovations in the district. Facilities Planning and Construction is well underway with planning for the summer 2010 renovation projects. Teams of architects were developed and general contractors to complete the summer project tasks.

Dr. Jackie Rosswurm, Chief Administrative and Human Resource Services Officer, and Jennifer Staton, Risk Manager, gave a status report on insurance coverage for property and liability and worker's compensation.
