Board of Education Summary May 4, 2010 School Board Meeting

Chairman Fred Washington called the meeting to order at 6:00 P.M.

Dr. Wayne Carbiener made a motion to purchase land from the Herritt Family 1.25 acres to include a fifty foot easement adjacent to Bluffton Middle School for a purchase price of \$263,158 utilizing capital funds. Motioned passed.

Vice-Chairmen Bob Arundell made a motion to enter into an official short-term land lease with the Bluffton Township Fire District for property situated at the corner of Burnt Church Road and Bridge Road. The lease agreement shall not allow for any further expansion of existing facilities or land use. Motion passed.

Vice-Chairmen Bob Arundell made a motion to sustain the Superintendent's suspension and recommendation for the dismissal of a professional employee, Employee A, for the reasons provided by the Superintendent subject to the Board's duty to review the matter on the merits pursuant to the South Carolina Code Ann. 59-25-470 should the employee request a hearing. Motion passed.
