Superintendent's Report:

Ms. Martha Bryan of Webster-Rogers CPA firm presented the Annual External Audit Report. According to Ms. Bryan, the District has had a clean audit for the 12th year in a row. She talked about the deficit caused by lack of collections. She explained that the shortfall last year was not because the district exceeded its budget but because collections were not what were expected. She said Beaufort County has the lowest collection rate of those districts she has audited. Mrs Bryan went over various facets of the audit, including single audit areas, federal fund audits, and procurement procedures.

Dr. Sean Alford went over the 2012-2013 school calendars. Board members had several questions regarding days off as they relate to the Heritage Golf Tournament and schools in the southern part of the county and Extended Learning Time days. Following discussion, the Board voted to table the decision.
