

Topic of Summary	READ 180 Program Evaluation Data- 3 Yr. for BCSD: 2013-2014; 2014-2015; 2015-2016
READ 180 Program Summary	<p>READ 180 is a reading intervention program for students in Grades 4–12 who read two years (or more) below grade level. The Scholastic Reading Inventory (SRI) is a technology-based universal screener and progress monitoring tool. The SRI is administered at the beginning of the school year and is used to generate the reading level for each student tested, which will determine if the student is a candidate for intervention. READ 180 tracks students’ growth over time and should guide instruction for each students’ needs throughout the school year. At the end of the school year, the SRI is administered again to determine how much growth each individual student achieves.</p> <p>The READ 180 program requires a 90 minute block of intervention time and should not replace the ELA instruction for each grade level. The format of the class includes the teacher beginning and ending each class session with whole group instruction, then students break into one of three rotations. First, the teacher leads small group instruction using a workbook. Second, students work independently in the READ 180 software Third, students read independently selecting books from the READ 180n paper or audio book library. Within the READ 180 program, teachers should confer with each individual student to set and monitor goals for the school year. Student goals should reflect more than one year of growth to assist each student in reaching their grade level targets if fidelity of the READ 180 program implementation is followed.</p> <p>In monitoring student performance within the READ 180 program results in BCSD, most students and schools, (even though most students are significantly below grade level proficiency) have made some gains within the READ 180 program according to increases from the SRI Test 1 and SRI Test 2. However, when measuring grade level proficiency gains of student performance from the SRT Test 1 and SRI Test 2, most students (and schools) do not show one year of growth for one year of time, which continues to increase gaps for students that perform significantly below grade level. SRI data was compared to MAP data.</p>
