When Islands Academy was recognized as a Potentially Underperforming School on Dec. 4, 2017 they received state funds of\$120,000 for the middle school and the high school. As of 11/19/18 there was a YTD Carryover amount of \$105,839 with a remaining balance of \$86,432.78 which had to be spent by 6/30/19. Because the school was closed, the remaining money was to go back to the state. I am unaware of the total amount going back, or when that would take place due to me not being in Finance. To my knowledge there is no other state funding Islands Academy received.

Former Superintendent Jeff Moss and school board chairman Earl Campbell were first alerted to problems at the school in Dec. 2017, when it was identified by the S.C. Department of Education as a "potentially underperforming school," but an organized, concerted effort to improve student success did not take place, according to district documents.

My question is this; did the Beaufort County School District receive any additional funds or any other type of assistance from the state to turn the situation around? If so, how much was received and how was it spent?
